Meet your Oblate guide at the Amphitheatre parking lot. Walking is required to reach the Amphitheatre but is also wheelchair accessible. Next, you will visit the Chapel of Santo Niño de Cebú, Christ the King Chapel and Rosary Courts. *Optional Rosary may be said at this time – please advise prior to arrival.*
